### Join Our Editorial Group: Help Shape Design Discourse

The mission of *Design Issues* is to enrich the understanding and practice of design in any area of human endeavor. This may lie in the investigation of design in the past, present, or future, whether through history, criticism, or theory, speculation, and philosophy. Contributions may come from any of the design disciplines or from a wide variety of other disciplines, provided that the work adds to the richness of our understanding of design with evidence of originality, rigor, and significance. The mixture of history, criticism, and theory is based on our commitment to a pluralistic, interdisciplinary approach that includes different perspectives and methods of narrative and argument. This has been the signature of *Design Issues* for the past forty years and it underpins the selection and publication of articles in the journal today.

### Position: Editor

We invite applications to join the Editorial Group of the journal from individuals who are similarly committed to the development of design discourse. The editors of *Design Issues* are committed to equity and diversity and warmly welcome applications from under-represented constituencies. Early career academics are encouraged to apply.

Each Editor participates in monthly online meetings with the full Editorial Group. As with all Editors, there is no remuneration for the position. The ideal candidate should have relevant skills to be an editor, have strong communication and organizational skills, and be familiar and engaged with contemporary design discourse. The selected candidate will serve in the role for one year with the potential for subsequent extension.

Applicants may email Managing Editor Gail Papay (gail.papay@case.edu) a cover letter that highlights your relevant experience, briefly states what you would bring to this role, and indicates how you might benefit from such a role. Please also attach your CV or resume, a brief bio, and a list of publications. The editorial search committee may request additional relevant materials throughout the candidate review process.
