Welcome to MIT Press Direct

The Direct platform is home to MIT Press's scholarly books accessible to purchasing and subscribing institutions worldwide. [The MIT Press](#), an operating unit of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, is a leading publisher of books and journals at the intersection of science, technology, and the arts.

A. Authorized Users

Under this Agreement, the MIT Press grants you, an Authorized User, a personal, revocable, limited, non-transferable license to access content on the MIT Press Direct platform.

“Authorized Users” are the employees, faculty, staff, students, alumni, and walk-in library patrons using a Purchasing or Subscribing Institution's library facilities.

B. Permitted

An Authorized User may

1. Download chapters and other similar quantities of Content for personal use, and archive similar quantities of such material on his/her own personal computer. Note: the purpose of this is to enable research-driven, as-needed downloading.
2. Print out chapters and other similar quantities of Content for personal use.
3. Distribute one copy of a chapter or other similar quantity of Content by email, hard copy or fax to one person at another location for that individual's personal use as above, without altering or obscuring any copyright or other identifying information.
4. Make traditional scholarly re-use of material within the bounds of [fair use](#).

C. Not Permitted

Authorized Users may not

1. Disseminate Content outside the campus or institution by any means, except as noted above.
2. Systematically download content by robots or other automatic processes without explicit approval from MIT Press.
3. Burden server(s) with activities, such as computer programs, that automatically download content, commonly known as web robots, spiders, crawlers, wanderers, or accelerators. If there is evidence that such unauthorized activities have taken place, the Authorized User's Purchasing or Subscribing Institution will be contacted, and access to the offending IP address(es) may be shut down if a prompt resolution is not achieved.
4. Remove, cover, overlay, obscure, block, or change any copyright notices, legends, or terms of use: or modify or create a derivative work of any Journal content without the prior written permission of the copyright holder.

5. re-use content for commercial use without prior written permission of the MIT Press.
6. Make agreements for access to Content with individuals, organizations, vendors, affiliates, or partners, who are not Authorized Users.
